General Rules & Regulations

1. This Society shall be called "Trawden & District Agricultural Society"
2. The Directors of the Society shall consist of Chairperson, Vice Chairperson, Treasurer and Company Secretary.
3. The Officers of the Society shall consist of President, Chairman, Vice Chairman, Treasurer, General Secretary, Show Manager and Committee; five to form a quorum.
4. All Officers shall be elected annually at the General meeting of the Society, which shall be held on such a day and at such a place as the Society may appoint.
5. The affairs of the Society and the application of its funds shall be under the management of the Committee, who will settle all matters that may be in dispute.
6. The Society reserves the right to cancel or amalgamate any class with insufficient entries.
7. All exhibitors do so subject to the Rules and Regulations laid down by the Society. If a dispute arises for which no special rule is laid down, same shall be referred to the Directors and Officers, whose decision shall be final.
8. Show Secretaries shall not in any way disclose or make known to any person whatsoever, until the day of the show, the names of the competitors for any prizes.
9. All exhibits are displayed at Owners Risk. The Society will accept no responsibility for loss, damage, accident of theft.
10. Prize winning stock to be paraded when called upon, or forfeit prize money and/or trophy.
11. All entries to be presented at times stated by Section Secretary.
12. Any Exhibitors Assistant not in possession of an Entrance Ticket must pay the full admission fee.
13. All persons attending the Show do so at their own risk. The Society cannot be made liable for personal accident or liability or damage to vehicles or property.
14. Livestock exhibited at the Show must have been the bone-fide property of the exhibitor for at least two calendar months previous to the show date.
15. Secretaries and Stewards of each section will establish eligibility of any entry in that section.
16. Trophies to be held for one year unless otherwise stated. Winners are responsible for the care of the trophy during this term and for its safe return to the Society before the next show.
17. Parking regulations must be observed. The Society has the right to remove any vehicle which is considered an obstruction in any way or is moving on the showground between 10:00am and 4:30pm.

Ingredients

200g light brown soft sugar,
 200ml vegetable or sunflower oil, plus extra for the tin,
 4 eggs, 175g self-raising flour,
 ½ tsp baking powder,
 75g shelled pistachios, ground (omit if desired/allergy)
 1 medium courgette (about 150g), grated,
 2 limes, zested and juiced.

For the topping

275g soft cheese,
 100g icing sugar,
 1 lime, zested and juiced,
 25g shelled pistachios, roughly chopped.

Method

Heat the oven to 180C/160C fan/ gas 4.
 Oil a 900g loaf tin and line with baking parchment.
 Combine the sugar, oil and eggs in a large bowl and mix well.
 Fold in the flour, baking powder and ground pistachios.
 Squeeze out as much moisture as you can from the grated courgette using your hands (don't worry about squeezing out every drop), then add this to the bowl along with the lime zest and half the juice and mix to combine.
 Bake for 40-50 mins until a skewer inserted into the middle comes out clean.
 Check the cake after 30 mins – if it's looking too brown, cover with foil for the remaining cooking time. Leave to cool in the tin for 20 mins,
 Transfer to a wire rack, poke a few holes in the top using a skewer and pour over the remaining lime juice. Leave to cool completely.
 For the frosting, tip the soft cheese into a bowl, sift over the icing sugar, pour in the lime juice and mix to combine.
 Spread this over the top of the cooled cake, then sprinkle with the chopped pistachios and lime zest.

Conditions of Entry

- C1. Entries** – officially close at **10.00 pm on Sunday 23rd July** and should be on the official entry form, if at all possible. Entries for Juniors can be accepted by post, email or telephone. You can download forms from the TDAS website. No late entries can be **guaranteed** entry, but every effort will be made to deal with late entries or changes for Juniors. If late entries are accepted, they will not be listed in the Show Catalogue due to printing deadlines.
- C2. Exhibits** - must be the work of the entrant and made in the 12 months prior to the Show. The Secretary may challenge whether the entry has essentially been made by the child. No kits are accepted as entries. The entrant must be the appropriate age for each class on Show Day.
- C3. HELP!** Younger children may need a little help with some parts of their entries, for example, if sharp tools or heat are needed. **But it is their entry, not yours.** If you have essentially made something for them, please enter it into the **Adult crafts** – you know you want to!
- C4. Delivery** – Any particularly large items or multiple entries, for example school or group entries, may be collected or delivered by prior arrangement. All entries must be brought to the Junior Section marquee on the Showground, and labelled and benched, either:
a) between 5.00 pm and 6.00 pm on Saturday 12th August 2023, or
b) before 9.30 am on Show Day, Sunday 13th August 2023.
- C5. Entry Fee** – there is **no entry fee** for any Junior entry, and there is **no free entry** to the Show for Junior entrants. Remember to wear your wristband on the Showground!
- C6. Labelling** – the name of the entrant must not be visible on any entry. Every entry must have an entry number securely attached to it before being left in the Junior marquee. The numbers will be available from the Secretary in the marquee at the times at number 4 above.
- C7. Judging** – will begin at 10.00 am and the marquee will be closed during judging. The judges' decisions are final.
- C8. Prizes** – Rosettes and certificates will be awarded to 3rd place in each class. Extra places may be awarded at the judges' discretion. Rosettes will be awarded for each Best in Section, the Best in Show, and Most Individual Points. Any trophies will be awarded and presented to winners in the marquee at 4.00 pm.
- C9. Family Trophy** – will be awarded to the family (minimum one parent, one child: grandparents and other family members are also included) gaining most points across Junior, Adult Crafts and Horticulture Sections. Family members with full names and relationship **must** be listed on the Junior entry form. There will be a Rosette awarded to the 2nd Family. Points will be counted as follows: 1st = 3 points, 2nd = 2 points, 3rd = 1 point, Best in Section = 1 point, Best in Show = 1 point.
- C10. Removal of exhibits** – exhibits may be removed after 4.15 pm on Show Day.
- C11. Trophies** – must be kept in good condition and returned to the Section Secretary or to Hedgehogs Florists prior to Trawden Show 2024.
